What are we looking for?

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

All candidates should be a graduate by the time the course starts, with a 1st, 2:1 or 2:2 degree with honours.

Your degree is not required to be subject specific but you should be able to demonstrate a strong subject knowledge in your chosen subject.

GCSE

All candidates must have at least 4 / C grade (or equivalent) for GCSE Maths & English. All primary candidates should also have 4 / C grade (or equivalent) in a Science subject.

Any candidates, who have their qualifications still pending when considering applying to us, will still be interviewed and if successful will be required to provide proof of qualifications before the course start date.

The National Recognition Information Centre for the United Kingdom (UK NARIC) can provide advice on the equivalence of overseas qualifications.

In addition to meeting the entry requirements The Coventry SCITT is looking for the following qualities:

- Desire to help children achieve their potential
- Be highly motivated, enthusiastic and resilient
- Understand the need to safeguard pupils
- Willingness to contribute to the wider life of a school



On your application form, you will be required to include your personal details, education and qualifications, school and work experience, a personal statement, subject knowledge and references.

If your application is shortlisted, you will be invited to attend an interview.

The interview process is split in to the following four parts:





scitt TRAINING

Induction and immersion weeks

Four days of developmental training at the start of term which will equip the trainee with the tools they need to begin teaching, including professional behaviours and pedagogy, this will include: pupil tracking, lesson observations, meeting expert colleagues, gathering pupil data and specific safeguarding in a school context. These sessions will incorporate a blended approach of centre-based training and school based training.


Teaching placements

Two complementary placements - Trainees are involved in the decision making process when choosing a main placement school. We endeavour to place trainees in one of their three choices of schools.

Two and a half terms in the main placement and a half term in a school that is chosen for the trainee based on their training needs We have over 25 schools in our partnership based in Coventry and Warwickshire.

Experience weeks

- Primary school placement for secondary trainees
- KS3 placement for primary trainees
- SEND week, including experience of special school placement. Trainees will undertake a two day 'SEND' placement during the spring term – the purpose of this is to enable the trainees to gain further experience in working with pupils with specific needs and how to adapt teaching (relating to Teacher Standard 5).
- EYFS Focus Week for primary trainees
- Phonics Focus Week for primary trainees



Pastoral support:

Your in-school mentor will be your first port of call providing you with guidance and support. You can also talk to one of the SCITT team. There is also an opportunity to access counselling services should you require them.

End of training Qualification:

At the end of the year trainees will be recommended for QTS (Qualified Teacher Status) awarded by The Coventry SCITT and a PGCE (Post-graduate certificate in education) awarded by Coventry University.

QTS Training

The Coventry SCITT centre based training takes place all day on a Monday. Trainees will be in their main school placement for the remaining four days of the week.

PGCE Training

Collaboratively delivered with Coventry University, the PGCE covers four school based assignment modules. Trainees will achieve 60 level 7 credits when they have successfully completed the PGCE. All PGCE training will be incorporated into our SCITT Monday training days.

There are different routes that you as a trainee can train to teach in.

SCITT Route

The SCITT programmes allow you to learn on the job as you work towards your Qualified Teacher Status (QTS) recommendation.

- SCITT programmes are popular with students who are hoping to gain a position in their placement school following their training.
- Although the training is based in a school, you will not be an employee of the school.
- Trainees will be liable for tuition fees however funding is available through student loans, bursaries, or scholarships if eligible.
- The cost of this course is £9250.00

Assessment Only Route

- The assessment only route to qualified teacher status (QTS) allows unqualified teachers to demonstrate that they already meet all the QTS standards, without the need for any further training.
- This route is usually taken up from recommendation of a headteacher of the employing school.
- This is a 12 week course where the teacher needs to present detailed evidence and have a supporting school.
- After 12 weeks, if the teacher has demonstrated they have met all of the Teacher's Standards, The Coventry SCITT will recommend for QTS.
- The cost of this course is £2250.00



Part-time Courses

- This route allows a trainee to study part-time over the course of two academic years.
- The trainee will study three days a week (one must be a Monday) towards achieving QTS and the PGCE.
- This allows flexibility for potential trainees with commitments outside of their work life.
- The cost of this course is £9250.00 for two years.


